Rolling River Rampage is this year's theme for the Vacation Bible School to be held August 13-17, with a special 9:30 am worship service on August 19. We had 50 adults help us last year and we did *not* have enough volunteers! We will need to get everyone who is willing to help in some way vetted as this must be done every year. We will have a volunteer form in the worship bulletins on the first Sunday of each month from now on. Please feel free to print your name on the back of it and what area you are willing to help in (if you have a preference). At this time we need help in every area. This year's Relay will be a one-day event on Saturday, June 23, starting at noon and going through midnight. However, walking around the track will take place following the opening ceremony and will end after the closing ceremony (around midnight).

You may sign up for a time slot, make a donation, or purchase luminaries. You can purchase a luminary for \$10 to honor a cancer survivor or to honor the memory of a loved one. These will be placed around the Oriole Field track during the event.
